



Initial situation:

- In Bulgaria, the Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Poland, Romania and Slovenia there is a multitude of radioactive ponds containing the tailings of the former and currently still operating uranium milling.
- The uranium milling plant Pécs (Hungary) is selected as an example demonstrating the technological possibilities of a fine tailings stabilisation as a basis for a following remediation.



Main tasks:

- Elaboration of methods to inventorise and to analyse the structure and stability of the tailings pond.
- Development of a geotechnical investigation programme.
- Training of experts of the participating countries in the contents and application of the installed computer software.
- Proposals for the stabilisation of the tailings ponds including cost-benefitanalysis for both the plant in Pécs and other tailings ponds in the CEEC.
